Jean served the Parish Council for 16 years, and during her 3 terms as Chairman, her commitment, attention to detail and ability to see the wider view guided the council on many successful projects. Perhaps the one that she was most proud of was the creation of the modern and colourful children's play area, which draws many appreciative users.

Throughout her illness Jean only missed one Parish Council meeting, which speaks volumes for her dedication to the village and its population.

She also served on the Parochial Church Council for 6 years and on the Village hall Management Committee since its inception. The village was very important to her having lived here for 19 years.

Jean will be greatly missed by all who came to know her, by her loving husband Keith, daughter Helen, son-in-law Kristian and grand daughter Rachel.


Glow worms

From late June and into July, glow worms can be found in some of our local woods (Brampton Wood, Westwood and Grafham Water Nature Reserve).

Glow worms are now rather rare. They are beetles. The wingless female, glows at the tip of her tail and resembles a woodlouse. The male has wings to take him to the females cold glowing light at dusk and through the night.

Glow worms feed on snails and during the day they hide away from predators.

The Victorians called them Love Lanterns.

The Wyvern

In spite of the name on their boarding, the road in the Bloor Homes development is to be called **The Wyvern**. But why such a name you cry! Well, all new developments within our village have all originated from our history so why change now? Some of you might remember that Grafham once had a railway station many years ago. The Bloor development is being built on the Station site. Railways have over many years played an important part in our history. In 1862 the Midland Railway received authority to construct a railway line from Kettering to Huntingdon thereby making a connection with the Great Northern Railway. The Midland Railway completed the line from Kettering through Grafham to Huntingdon on 21st January 1866 with a passenger train service in full operation on 1st March 1866. The emblem of the Midland Railway was a

Wyvern being a dragon-like figure. Today this emblem can be seen at the Midland Railway Trust at Butterley in Derbyshire and features on their publicity.

In keeping with our Village history and our railway the association is maintained hence with the road being named **The Wyvern**.



GRAFHAM PARISH PLAN

RESIDENTS MEETING - 2 JULY 2005



The purpose of the meeting was to identify priorities from the recommendations developed by the Grafham Plan Steering Group from the input of residents. Also, although some of the initiatives were already underway, it would be impossible for the Parish Council alone to bring the major issues to fruition and it was necessary to establish groups of interested individuals who could assist.

The Parish Councillors and the Chairman of the Steering Group briefly outlined the objectives and findings of the Plan. The main objectives were grouped under the six main headings:

- Community Services
- Transport and Access**
- Public Information**
- Grafham Wildlife and Conservation
- Village Hall and Sports
- Youth Council**

The Parish Council recommended that although **all** would continue to be addressed through existing arrangements or Councillor responsibilities, those highlighted in bold would have initial priority and would require additional support. From the discussion that followed it was clear that the Village Hall and Sports initiatives should be given priority, but that this could be linked to the Youth Council to form a single group. Thus the agreed priorities are:

- Transport and Access**
- Public Information**
- Village Hall, Sports and Youth**

The intention is now to form action groups to take forward a series of initiatives within these subject areas. For example, there is a strong need for youth facilities within the Village and the input of parents and teenagers will be immensely valuable in such actions. Equally, there is a significant interest in developing the Village Hall facilities and in providing tennis and other sporting activities. There are many exciting ideas and potentially the financial opportunity to bring these to fruition. What is essential is the willingness of residents to bring their expertise, skills and enthusiasm to enable us to achieve these goals. We already lead most of Cambridgeshire in the reality and quality of a Village Plan. We have a tremendous opportunity to improve the quality of life in our Village, but we do need your help for as little or as much time as you are able to give. If you were unable to register your interest at the meeting, but are able to help on one, or indeed more, of these groups do let us know.
