

The Council has received another respectable sum of money from the District Council from the re-cycling banks - £348.41. This money, together with the earlier receipt has now been paid over to the Village Hall Committee.

It is very good to know that the facility is being so well used. Please carry on recycling - it is helping to provide the VHC with useful funds for the benefit of the villagers and of course, it is good for the environment too!

Plans are now being drawn up to provide an all-weather sports facility for the village. This is still at quite an early stage and a lot of work is going on to find funding and to come up with a facility which will be suitable for most people.



You may know that the Council decided that Grafham should have a village sign. They would now like to have your ideas for its design and invite all villagers to come up with something which identifies our village, either from the present day or from its history. You can make this a family effort if you want to and the Council is offering a prize of £50 for a winning family or single entry. If you want to enter a design you can do it on paper or electronically and the Council will be judging all entries at its next meeting which is on 12th September.

The Area Joint Committee of the District Council agreed at their meeting on 5th June that the traffic thumps in Breach and Buckden Roads should be removed. The Council is continuing to press for a removal date, but so far no date has been set.





GRAFHAM CRICKET CLUB

1st July 2006: the 90th Anniversary of the first day of the battle of the Somme; England vrs Portugal in the quarter finals of the World Cup; the death of Fiery Fred Trueman, fast bowler for England and Yorkshire during the 50s and 60s, and Grafham CC vrs Riseley CC. The match was to make an early start at 10.30am, because the visiting team wanted to be at home to watch the previously mentioned football match. A hot day; a cerulean sky, with a heat haze simmering on the square, the skipper again loses the toss, Riseley opt to bat first. Eric Bailey had prepared a pitch that was a batsman's dream, and a bowler's nightmare.

Adam Dighton took the first wicket when the score was 18, but Riseley made good use of the dream wicket, steadily scoring as the heat rose to put on a further 53 before the second wicket fell to John Fozzard. A sharp

catch at square by the skipper Adi Love off Adam Dighton's bowling accounted for Riseley's top scoring batsman, who made 85, with the wicket falling at 144. Steady bowling by Adi Love and Adam Dighton restricted Riseley's total to 178 for 5.

After a short lunch, it was Grafham's turn to bat on the dream wicket. The opening partner-ship of Duncan Palmer and Gareth Harris made 84 runs before Gareth was out LBW for 42. The innings started to falter, when two more wickets fell for an addition of just 30 runs. The fourth wicket partnership added a further 20 runs, with Duncan Palmer steadily mounting his personal score. Duncan was finally out after making 66, when the team's total was at 161. The final partnership of Peter Jennings and Adi Love saw Grafham home with 179 for 5 in 35

overs. This was Grafham's second victory of the season which allowed Riseley plenty of time to return home to watch the football.

Grafham CC on Tour. The Bedford league allows its team one Saturday off during the cricket season, which this year was on July 8th 2006. Grafham organised a friendly cricket match for the Sunday in North East Yorkshire against Lockton village near Pickering. In complete contrast to the week before, it was a typical Yorkshire summer weather, light rain in a strong wind, followed by intermittent sunshine in a strong wind. Lockton's cricket ground is a picturesque ground by the main Whitby road, with tempting short boundaries, and a slight slope towards the pavilion. The Grafham skipper won the virtual toss, and put Lockton into bat. Lockton went on to make 70 without loss in the first 20 overs. Gareth Harris took the first wicket, but an inspired piece of Captaincy brought Duncan Palmer on to bowl, who proceeded to take two wickets with his first two bowls, and narrowly missed taking a hat trick. Duncan ended his spell with 4 wickets for 13 runs. Lockton went on to make 172 runs.

Grafham replied with a good opening partnership of 57, but the batting gem of the innings was from Andy Page who made 53 not out, with support from Adam Dighton of 23 not out. Grafham finished on 176 for 4 in 33 overs, the third victory of the season. A great weekend away, with a match that lived up to its "friendly" labelling.
