PARISH NEWS... March 2008 The PC's planning application for lighting and fencing around the

all-weather sports facility is due to be heard on 17th March. It is expected to be approved subject to conditions concerning the landscaping, tree planting and fencing type.

Trees and hedging plants are to be provided by the District Council for planting in Brampton Road. In particular to replace hedge which has been killed off by the weeds and bramble that was rampant in the hedge in front of the Luminus properties.

Some work needs to be done to clear the ditch in front of the hedge before this planting can take place and Luminus Group will arrange this. Two or more trees will also be planted near to the playground but away from any properties.

The Parish Council would like to remind you that there is an open forum at the beginning of every council meeting for you to come and talk to the council if you have any concerns about events in the village, matters for improvement or council's actions. The council takes this part of the meeting very seriously and will give as much time as is needed to discuss your concerns. If you don't feel you want to attend a meeting, you are welcome to contact any of the councillors by telephone or e-mail. All contact details are reproduced in this newsletter.

The Parish Council were very sorry to receive the resignation of Gill Findlay this month. Gill joined the council two years ago and we have all enjoyed working with her. We thank her for her contribution and work during these two years and wish her the best for her future.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH In the last week of February there was a spate of bin fires

and arson attacks on the Oxmoor Estate, Hartford, Hinchingbrooke and Godmanchester. In Oak Drive substantial damage was caused to a building. The police have asked for members of the public to report immediately any young people playing with lighters or matches or any sort of petrol bomb or similar article. The bins being targeted are the general waste bins (black) and recycling bins (blue). The police advice is keep bins in the garden and do not put out until collection day. I have been asked to quote the following:

As part of the proposed A14 expansion/bypass a number of agencies will be doing preparatory work. One of these is an environmental consultancy who will be assessing the impact on

wildlife, particularly badgers. They will be establishing badger territory and sett locations by non-invasive means. To do this they place food containing small plastic beads outside setts and then find the beads after they've been through the badger. These harmless beads may be noticed by members of the public and could be mistaken for poison. If there is any doubt as to the identity of the beads please call the police on 0854 456456

Please be aware that wild birds will start nest building in March. Once construction of nests has commenced it is an offence to damage or destroy the nest - e.g. by hedge cutting/tree felling (Wildlife country act 1981) For further information regarding wild birds and law please contact PC 1387 Paul Carter via the control room.

In the week end of 2nd March over three separate days two middle aged men and a teenage boy were seen hanging around suspiciously in the village and later it was discovered they had a small white lorry parked by the nature reserve down Brampton Road. They also had two horses and a dog. The police went out on the Sunday night to check all of this but they could not see the people. If anyone sees these distinctive people again please call the police - part of the registration of one of the vehicles is OU52.

Nothing is able to be done currently about the speeding of vehicles leaving the village down Buckden Road, however, an incident occurred whereby a resident living in the High Street was estimated to be doing a speed of 80MPH - this has been reported to the police and I have been asked to remind everyone that the limit is 60MPH. Finally, please call the police direct and not myself to report all instances in the first case - I am then happy to log it on the monthly report as a warning. However, it is not my responsibility to be first point of contact.

Buckden Surgery Patients Association (BSPA)

Dr Bundy has left us as planned, at the end of February on maternity leave and we eagerly await news of the safe delivery of her baby. Whilst she is away, her work will be covered by Dr Alexandra Steffes and we very much hope she will enjoy being part of the team.

By the time this letter is published, new blinds will have been fitted in the surgery and all that remains to complete the renovation is the choice of pictures. As noted last month, there will be a competition to choose the best four photographs of local views, so please submit your pictures on a CD to the surgery and the Patients Association Committee will choose the best. These will be printed onto canvas blocks and will hang in the Waiting Room - please do include your name so that they can be attributed appropriately. The closing date will be the end of April so there is just one month to go and we would welcome as many entries as you can give us!

Patients attending the Buckden Surgery during a week in February were asked to complete a questionnaire about all aspects of their visit and their overall experience of the surgery. The results have now been collated and show a high level of satisfaction, well above the national benchmark figures - please do see the copy available in the surgery. Initiatives to improve telephone access and to reduce patient waiting times have proved effective with a significantly increased approval rating since the previous survey.

As patients we can continue to play our part by avoiding routine telephone enquiries between 8am and 10am and, when booking appointments, remember the maxim 'one problem, one appointment' so if your problem is complex please book a double appointment.

On the wider front, the Primary Care Trust [PCT] has decided that the Cambridgeshire Darzi Walk-in Health Centre is to be opened in St Neots and it will be open from 8am to 8pm seven days a week. Obviously some people may find this useful but it does need to be put in the context of GP services generally and specifically in the con-

text of the allocation of limited resources and value for money. These centres will be run by the least expensive doctors and there will be little or no continuity of care i.e. a different doctor each time you go. Please remember that after extensive research, 84% of people are satisfied with their GP availability. GPs are a highly valued and cost effective branch of the NHS. Consultations in

walk-in clinics and those using NHS Direct cost more than the same consultation with your own GP, and, in many cases these initial consultations lead to a referral back to the patients own GP - which more than doubles the cost. There is strong evidence to suggest that it is predominantly the 'walking well' who use these new clinics, whereas the elderly and chronically sick and those with complex problems remain with their GPs thus distorting the patient balance within a practice. I believe that these centres will significantly destabilize general practices throughout the areas in which they are to be set up and that will have a detrimental effect on local GPs who have invested their professional lives in their practices. Commercial firms are determined to be involved and indeed Boots the Chemist already employs the former Health Secretary Patricia Hewitt as an advisor. Is this the start of selling off primary care to the private sector?

These new clinics are going to cost an enormous amount of money to set up and this can only come from money already allocated to the PCT's budget - there is no new money for them. At our local level, we can see from where this money is being taken. So, when our GPs are taking care of an increasing number of acutely ill patients needing careful monitoring and regular blood tests etc. the PCT is unwilling to pay for the nursing staff to do this work. The surgery used to have four part-time district nurses, but now the PCT will only employ two part-time nurses who have to work extremely hard with the increasing workload they are given with increasingly early discharges from hospital. On top of that, we have lost our Health Visitor as well, and so we now have to be covered from St Neots. And, despite a detailed audit justifying the urgent need for more nurses, for the last two years the PCT has failed to finance the costs involved - and matters are getting ever more acute.






Huntingdon Shopmobility


