



As Christmas approaches I am starting to make plans to bring the ewes in. I am hoping, with Jim's help, to convert one of our old sheds into suitable winter accommodation for the ewes. Unfortunately it has taken a lot longer to clear the sheds than we had hoped so we may have to compromise on achieving the five star standard before Christmas, though I know Jim can work miracles! Anyway, the plan is to have the ewes in soon, so that we can start feeding them better quality rations in the eight week run up to lambing. Of course the other essential pre-Christmas activity is to make sure we have enough hay and feed in stock before the agricultural merchants stop deliveries.

View from the Pew!

As we enter 2010 let us look back briefly on some of the events at All Saints in the past year. The heavy snowfall last February prompted a photographic competition which resulted in the sale of Christmas cards in aid of SAS. "The Joy of Sax" recently was greatly enjoyed by all who attended and the community spirit engendered by this and similar events has been a blessing as well as the funds raised to help with the church "cracks". Thank you SAS to all those involved in their organisation and all who have supported them.

With regard to the cracks the PCC has appointed a new architect who has the results from all previous exploratory work and has recently been to examine the problem first hand. Attention to trees on the north side of the church has now taken place and the PCC is very grateful to Chris and Emma for this. We now hope to repair drainage to the north of the chancel. Following this there are three more costly jobs to be completed once tenders have gone out and grants are arranged. Meanwhile regular measuring and monitoring of the cracks is carried out to identify any unusu-



al signs of movement. Other events during the vear include a series of children's services. including a well attended Easter Egg Hunt, Jonathan's 40th anniversary of his ordination as Deacon, the Well Dressing and Church Fête, the Flower Festival and three weddings - so the Flower Club has been extremely busy keeping our church looking beautiful and well -

cared for. We are still desperate for church cleaners and if you can spare some time to help us in that way we would be delighted. The plant and book stall have obviously been a great attraction so keep those books coming in. The plant stall has been temporarily "put to bed" over the winter but will re-appear next year with new stock.

Our "Lights to Remember" service on 29th November was a peaceful and moving experience. With candles lit around the church and the ones lit by those who were remembering their loved ones it was a special time. Our coffee and mince pie morning on 5th December was a great success, thank you to all those who supported us. At the time of going to press we still look forward to our Carol Service and Crib Service immediately before Christmas. Owing to the semi-retirement of a member of the clergy in

the East Leightonstone group of parishes, Jonathan and Martin have taken on three extra parishes: Hamerton, Gidding and Winwick. To enable them to minister to those parishes, we at Grafham are going to have some help from Brampton and Ann Allsop who is a licensed lay minister will normally be taking the service here on the third Sunday of each month. We look forward to welcoming her for the first time on 17th January.

Looking forward to the new year we have two special services to put in your diary. On 31 January, Candlemas Sunday, there will be a Christingle Service at 4 pm. This service has a special appeal for children and the story of Christingle is illustrated in the orange, sweetmeats and candle. Come along with your children and hear the story and enjoy the magic of those lit candles and those happy faces! The second special service is on 14 February which is St Valentine's Day so we will be celebrating "Love and Marriage". Communion will be available for those who wish to receive it. No doubt the church will be decorated in some appropriate way and there is a strong possibility of some delicious refreshments, so do join us.

PARISH NEWS...

The annual inspection of the playground area and equipment has recommended that a number of repairs are required. The Parish Council has accepted the report and the remedial works will be carried out as soon as possible.

Another of the recommendations is that dogs should be excluded from the playground in order to prevent the health risks which occur from fouling by dogs. There is a sign at the site which states that no dogs are allowed, but it is not possible to physically prevent dogs from entering unless we are all vigilant in keeping the gates closed and by not taking dogs into the area in the first place. Dog-fouling is an offence, as has been said before, and the Council will impose on offenders the full penalties allowed by law.

A bid for funds from the District Council is being put together to enable a significant upgrading of the village hall facilities. This will include new curtains and blinds, an upgrading of the electrics, loft insulation, refitted showers and a new kitchen.

A lot of people use the hall for a whole variety of events and fund- and their health and safety is of paramount importance.

We are now coming up to Christmas and that gives us all a lot of recycling opportunities. Please don't forget to use the recycling banks at the Village Hall as much as possible. The money we get from these banks provides the Village Hall Management Committee with much needed funds.




