In the late 1930s the Hart family moved from Northamptonshire to Hill Farm, Grafham with their son, James Lawrence Barney, better known to family and friends as Barry or Jim Hart. James Lawrence Barney Hart met and later married Dorothy (nee Dorks) who was born and raised at Station Row in the village. Together they worked hard running the farm and raising three sons, Barry, Jamie and David

Jim and Dorothy played an active role in many aspects of village life. Along with other parents of young families they negotiated with the landowner at the time, to secure a pasture field adjoining the village so that the village had its own sports ground and children's play area.

The 1970s saw the Cricket Club reformed and Jim and Dorothy would often watch matches. It was always their personal wish that one day the village would have a village hall and playing field that they could call their own. New development in the village enabled the family to relocate the playing field and finance the village hall. More recently the parish council were able to secure the field.



Jim died in September 1995 followed by Dorothy in 2002. Sadly, they were not able to see their vision for the village come to fruition.

I would like to thank the village for allowing me to place this bench in memory of my parents. I hope that those

who use the bench on match days will be witness to many a, "Century and fallen wicket."

Grafham Cricket Club

The home game against Riseley was a real cliff hanger. Riseley have one outstanding all round player in: A Monteith, who Grafham knew if he batted long enough could take the game away from us. So the relief was palpable when Adi Love in his ninth over bowled Mr Monteith after a quick fire 11 runs looked as though it would be so much more. Accurate bowling from Adi Love:10 overs 25runs for 3wkts; Chris Brown 9 overs 23runs for 3wkts, and Rob Forsdick taking a wicket with his first ball saw Riseley all out for 96 runs.

Mr Monteith opened the bowling for Riseley; bowling at a lively pace, quickly taking 2 wickets, with only Chris Brown seemingly comfortable with Mr Monteith's pace. But when Chris was caught from the bowling of the other Riseley opening bowler, Grafham quickly slipped to 36 for 6wkts with Mr Monteith having taken 5 of those wickets. It seemed what he could not do with the bat he would win the match with the ball. Tom Chester and Tom Clayton steadied the Grafham innings and halfway through this batting revival Mr Monteith was taken off. The two Toms took the Grafham innings to 89, to within 7 runs of victory. It was at this point that Mr Monteith resumed bowling, and quickly bowled both batsman for 22 each, leaving Grafham 90 for 8. A 4 from Jamie Smith, who was then bowled out next ball, left Grafham on 94 for 9, with Grafham's last two batsmen in. A 2 by Adi Love saw the scores equal, at 96 runs apiece. Mr Monteith then turned to bowl his last over. The first ball



faced by Chris Dighton rocketed harmlessly down the offside, with Adi halfway down the pitch wanting to take a quick bye while the ball was in the wicket keepers gloves. The next ball Chris Dighton guided down between Gully and Point for two runs. Grafham winning by two wickets; just! Mr Monteith finished the game

with 9.2 overs 32 runs and 7wickets. A game full of incident!

The last game of the season was away to Wilden II. The Wilden ground is picturesque; located on hill which overlooks gentle rolling farm countryside. The game was played in a strong wind, under a threatening grey sky which sometimes delivered rain. Wilden II batted first, and Grafham were soon amongst the wickets, with all Grafham bowlers sharing the spoils; Tom Chester 6 overs 10 runs for 1 wkt; Adi Love 8 overs 13 runs 3 wkts, Chris Brown 6 overs 24 runs 3 wkts; and Chris Dighton 4 overs 12 runs 2 wkts. Wilden were all out for 63 runs.

Grafham's opening pair put on 45 runs for the first wicket, followed quickly by two more, but a steady partnership between Chris Brown and Craig Pritchard saw Grafham home without further mishap. Grafham won the match by 7 wickets.

The 2011 season was a successful season for Grafham which apart from the major blip of being bowled out for 10, ended with Grafham playing 16 games, winning 11, drawing 1 and losing 4; scoring a creditable 272 points and finishing third in Division 2. A season full of incident!

PARISH NEWS

The Parish Council met on 13th September after the summer break. High on the agenda was a discussion to consider im-

provements to the village hall. The Village Plan has indicated that lots of you would like to have a meeting place for social events in the village. The Refurbishment Committee has given consideration to enlarging the village hall to include space for meetings and a social area, but in the first instance would like to improve and refit the kitchen, update the changing rooms and renew furniture and furnishings. The Council hope to be able to do this by using some existing funds and also by raising funds locally.



Cambridgeshire Highways have approved the Parish changes to priorities to make the road safer.

The Caravan Club have applied for planning permission scheme. for 10 new all-weather pitches and security barriers. The Council have no reason to recommend refusal, but have ber 2011. raised the issue of the road conditions leading to the Caravan Club and the potential for verge damage during the winter months. It may be necessary to get passing

points constructed on the road to prevent such dam-

The Council have received a couple of gueries concerning the responsibilities for keeping verges and grassed areas cut and tidy. The Council arranges the cutting of most of the verges in the village, the play-

ing field and the playground. However, it is considered that, if there is a grassed area outside your house, then you might want to be responsible for keeping that area tidy, as most people already do.

Arrangements are in hand to ensure that the grit bins are full for the coming winter season.

Would you like to see (and use) outdoor gym equipment around the village? The Council has received some information about this idea and will be considering it at a future meeting.

There will be an extraordinary meeting at a date yet to be fixed, at which the results of the Parish Plan questionnaire will be analysed and discussed in order to set the Parish Council's priorities for the next four years. Please watch the notice board for the date if you want to attend.

Cllr Peter Downes and the Council discussed the problems of poor broadband connection in Grafham. This is something that has been raised in the Village Plan. Cllr Downes issued copies of a communication from Noelle Godfrey who is involved in the process of implementing Council's request for improvements to the road markings the £20m project to deliver superfast broadband in Camand signage at the junction on Church Hill and Church bridgeshire and Peterborough and he advised the Council Road. This has been highlighted as a safety issue for that it would be necessary to maintain contact with the cyclists and walkers and so it is hoped to be able to make project and to keep up pressure to ensure that the scheme does not fall short of the outlying areas in the

A Shepherd's Tale - Sept 2011

Lack of a broadband connection for several days meant that I missed last month's edition, my apologies. There have been a number sheep sales and various comings and goings: six lambs went to Thrapston market, they looked quite small amongst some leggy continental lambs but fetched reasonable prices (£70) for their size; I also bit the bullet and finally culled the two ewes who had prolapsed at lambing. Various other lambs have also gone to the butcher and one small-

interesting reading; one of my rams is in the top three recorded Southdowns while dear old Furlong is right at the bottom because he produces good looking but smaller lambs, which while good for the show ring, is not quite what the butcher wants.

We now have an extra five acres of grass as we "undersowed" the spring barley next to Hill Farm with a grass mix at the same time as the barley was sown. This is usually a good technique as the barley protects the



holder bought four ewe lambs for a start up flock. To make up for these "sales" I have bought in some more ewes from a good flock in Kent; this means that 42 ewes will be going to the tup this autumn. I have also acquired one more ram - "Fusilier" who although now five years old has sired some very good lambs for his home flock and was also male champion at the Royal Welsh Show four years ago.

To monitor how my flock is doing we performance record the lambs; this includes weighing lambs and taking back scan measurements of the depth of muscle and fat in the "chops." We got the data back not long ago and it made

grass and provides a useful crop of grain and straw, while the grass slowly establishes. With this year's drought it has not done as well as I had hoped and the discerning botanists will spot that the field is also full of forage rape, the result of a misunderstanding between the seed supplier and the tractor driver ... still its useful extra grazing for the sheep!

As I write this we are planning to put sponges in the ewes to help synchronise oestrous (and lambing), the rams will go in two weeks time so keep an eye out for yellow bottoms on Church Road from 1st October.

The set top boxes that the Helpscheme provided to eligible residents are auto-retune so there should be no problem with them, but if help is required from the Helpscheme there is the Helpline on 0800 4085900 where someone will talk you through what needs to be done or arrange for someone to visit as part of the aftercare service. There is no charge.

For those people that were not eligible or are already watching digital television and need help retuning, the best advice is to call Digital UK on 08456 505050 who can talk you through how to retune your TV over the phone. Their number is charged at local rate.
