December. The flickering red candles and flowers were a lovely setting for the joyous singing of favourite carols and the traditional bible readings. Thank you to the ladies who provided the delicious cake and mulled wine which were enjoyed afterwards.

Carol singing around the village, organised by the sAs raised £213.04 and our thanks go to all those who sang themselves hoarse on that cold night and thank you to all those who filled our buckets with money.

It was a pleasure to see so many children at the Crib Service on Christmas Eve when bells, shakers and

"scrapers" accompanied the singing and the knitted characters were all returned safely to the crib. Children, don't forget our Christingle Service on 6th February at 4 pm (no 11am service that day). You will hear the story of the decorated orange and lighted candles and

have your own orange to take home.
We are very grateful to Bill Gerrard who kindly officiated at our Christmas Day Eucharist and also to John Dillistone who played the organ.
We began the new year with our Epiphany service, setting us on the road to a brighter future

with the strength of our Christian faith around us. On 30th January there will be no 11am service but a Group Eucharist at Alconbury at 10 am. This is to mark the end of the seven year partnership of the seven parishes. Although this leaves Jonathan with just five parishes it is still a heavy workload without any help, now that we do not have Martin Kettle's assistance. Therefore there will be some small changes in the pattern of services throughout the Group. In February at Grafham on the second Sunday 12th there will be an 8 am Eucharist but no 11am service. All are welcome to the 11am Eucharist at Ellington that day. On the third Sunday 19th there will be no 8 am Eucharist at Grafham but an 11am Sunday Worship service led by Ann Allsop from Brampton. We are exceedingly grateful to Ann for helping us in this way. We will keep readers informed of any other changes throughout the year.

The Grafham Railway Station Midland Railway

Grafham station was situated on the northern edge of the village, with the level crossing and gates sited on Breach Road. Along with other stations along the line Grafham opened for goods traffic on the 21st February 1866. The passenger service started later on the 1st March. Grafham station was small in size consisting of the station house, signal box, weighing machine, cattle pens and a coal yard with a short rail siding. During World War 2 this rail link played an important part supplying war materials to RAF Kimbolton air field. The end of the line for the passenger service for Grafham came on Monday 15th June 1959 and in the summer of 1961 the rail track between Kimbolton and Huntingdon was sadly lifted.







Gemma Clark will be attending the next Saturday morning councillor surgery at the Village Hall, if any one wishes to speak to her directly about concerns.


Thankfully nothing has been reported in Grafham.

PARISH NEWS...

December/January

The Parish Council welcomed Mr Brian Homewood to its ranks at the last meeting. Mr Homewood has been a parish councillor in the past and is looking forward to making a contribution to the community again. Unfortunately, Helen Breakspeare has resigned for personal reasons.

The sub-committee formed to project-manage the bid for funds for improving the village hall and its amenities was held during the month. Cllr Tyler has information concerning similar bids to ours and hopes to utilise this knowledge in putting together answers to a question-naire supplied by the Big Lottery. The committee members are Mike Tyler, Ian Gardener, Tracey Ibbett and Paul Knight. Cllr Tyler will be asking the District Council Community Officer to look over the draft of the bid as produced so far. However, we are likely to need the results of the Parish Plan before we can take the bid further.

If you think you have any expertise which could be useful to the committee, they would be pleased to hear from you. All contact details are as below.

The prospect of finding land suitable for allotment gardening is gathering pace slightly. Land to the right of Church Hill, which was suggested by Ely Diocese as a possible alternative to the land at the rear of the church, has some disadvantages. For example, traffic problems are likely to occur in an area where families frequently walk and cycle. Also, residents nearby are unlikely to support this idea and the Association are very keen that no residents are upset or inconvenienced by allotment gardens. The Chair of the Association will be making contact with another local land-owner to discuss the pos-

sibility of taking land behind the village hall. However, these are very early stage discussions.

The latest payment received in respect of the glass-recycling at £187 was significantly down on what we usually receive. We expect the bins

to be removed by the end of the financial year 2010-11. The Clerk presented the Parish Council with a proposed budget for 2011-12, which represents no increase to the precept received from the District Council.

At the January meeting we were pleased to welcome Cllr Peter Downes who was able to talk to us about the expected cuts in services and jobs at the County Council. These are likely to include cuts in social care, road maintenance and traffic safety, the closure of youth clubs and libraries and the closure of the Connection scheme which Grafham Parish Council were hoping to take advantage of this year. Schools budget, however, are to be protected. There will be no Council Tax increases either at County or District level.

A Shepherd's Tale

January 2010

It seems ages now since the snow and big freeze ended. I am certainly glad we had the flock indoors while it was going on. Our biggest hassle was frozen water pipes (they were lagged) and troughs. The sheep generate some heat - enough to stop pipes freezing in the low minuses- but we ended up taking buckets of water from the house. Luckily sheep are not heavy drinkers provided they are not producing milk so it was not too arduous. The barn is now almost finished with

just guttering and electrics to be fitted;

I am keen to have good lighting so I can see

what's happening when lambing starts. Just before Christmas, I had the ewes ultrasound scanned so I would know which ewes were carrying singles, twins and triplets. I was quite pleased with the results as we had a lot of young ewes lambing for the first time and was expecting fewer multiple births. The score was 4 ewes with triplets, 15 with twins and 10 with singles with one possibly barren ewe (she was served again the week before scanning). This works out at a lambing percentage at birth of 182% (the same as last year) but the real test is to get these lambs out safely and to keep them alive until they are sold. Whilst triplets -if they survive - are exciting, they are a nuisance. With only two teats, the ewes struggle to feed them properly so they will either have to bottle fed or fostered.





we had a visit from four final year students from Cambridge Vets School. They had to prepare a flock health plan; although they had one or two useful suggestions I was pleased to feel I was well on top of the case but I suspect that I am not a very typical sheep farmer. The other excitement was the arrival of Dirty Harry - my Christmas present; in reviewing my breeding plans for next year I had realised we needed one more ram. So while I was in Devon with my parents, I ploughed through the snow to visit one of the longest established Southdown flocks outside Tiverton to see what young rams they had. Harry was not their best

ram but I felt he had a good long back and excellent feet as well as some New Zealand blood so I felt he would work well with our flock. Why Dirty Harry? Well his father was named after Clint Eastwood... and the obvious alternative "the ram with no name" just didn't work for me! Let's hope he doesn't fire any blanks!

Buckden Surgery Patients Association (BSPA) A precis of an article by Sue Paul

■ Thank you to everyone who braved the extreme cold and icy pavements to support our Coffee Morning on 1st December. We raised £75 for our own funds.

There are a couple of other excitements to report; firstly

- The practice is experiencing some unexpected problems in appointing a doctor to cover maternity leave for Dr Leonard and Dr Bundy, but continues to work hard to find a suitable replacement.
- Dr Narmin Siddique, our trainee GP completes her 6 month attachment soon and will not be replaced until August. With two doctors on maternity leave, it is difficult to give the time and support a trainee GP needs and deserves.
- There is a lot in the media about flu, including some very tragic cases but it's important to keep a sense of perspective. If you think you have flu, please do not visit the surgery where there may be vulnerable patients. Stay at

there may be vulnerable patients. Stay at home in bed, keep warm, drink lots of fluids and if appropriate, take Paracetamol. If you are worried, phone the surgery requesting a telephone consultation and one of our doctors will call you back as soon as possible.



 Doctors from all 22 GP Practices that belonged to the former HuntsComm have been involved in the negotiating process to decide which bidder would win the franchise to run Hinchingbrooke Hospital. We now know it is to be Circle, who will 'shadow' the present management in preparation for taking control on 1st June. If Hinchingbrooke Hospital is to have a sustainable future, changes must be made to reduce unnecessary and expensive admissions when alternative options would be more appropriate. As a result, ther is to be a pilot scheme with a rota of local GPs providing primary care at the Hospital 'front door' using their experience and local expertise to decide if some patients could be safely treated without having to be admitted.

- It is hoped that a closer liaison between the hospital and the patient's GP will result in reducing how long a patient spends in hospital. This is particularly important in the case of elderly patients who want to remain independent as long as possible and for whom hospital can be a confusing and disorienting experience. A patient plan prepared prior to discharge is both essential and commonsense if best practice is to be delivered.
- Shirley Wimbleton has run the 200 Club for 10 years and has decided to step down later this year. Would anyone interested in taking over this splendid fund raising enterprise speak to her to find out what is involved. Thank you.
- Finally, I hope to have more information about the new 'Clusters' next month.
